- 4. Acceptance of the PAC Meeting minutes from November 29th, 2018 Julia Whyte made a motion to accept the minutes and Harper Hadden seconded.
- 5. Principal's Report (Ms Susie Car)
 - a. Newsletter
 - b. Ready Set Learn going to be on 22^{nd} , not the 21^{st} .
 - i. 47 Ks registered so far.
 - ii. With Guest author Vi Hughes (and maybe community librarian Marilyn)
 - c. Feb. 14 at 11am Lunar New Year Celebration hoping parents/families can join us
 - d. Curriculum Implementation Day Feb.15 no school for students
 - e. Family Day on Mon. Feb. 18 no school for students
 - f. New Activities: Lunch and After School Programs:
 - i. Ukulele Kids occurring at lunch time on Thursday. 30 children participating. Began Feb 7.
 - ii. Intro to Golf: 2 sessions 2 sessions of golf intro sessions this Friday (Feb 8) and one next week
 - iii. Looking into Lacrosse
 - 1. Possibility of after school 8 week program for gr. 1-5; depends on timing, may conflict with track and field and basketball.
 - 2. May also try to do an in-school clinic.
 - iv. Looking into Hip Hop (and other types of dance) with Joanne Fetchko
 - 1. A week or two. With the PE schedule. Still trying to schedule. May need PAC support
 - v. Renee Hock District Resource Teacher for Diversity / Anti-Racism for Parent Evening:
 - 1. This is being spoken of a lot in the district.
 - 2. No charge for parent night.
 - 3. Probably an hour presentation
 - 4. AIMS awareness, intervention, mitigation and support
 - a. How to deal with it, support your child and get them to speak with friends.
 - 5. Also does SOGI sexual orientation and gender identity, but think that AIMS is more important at this time. SOGI has been fairly well-covered.
 - 6. For School \rightarrow Will look at Lunch and Learn for the Staff.

- a. Classroom presentations tend not to have a long-term effect.
- b. Needs to be part of everything that staff do.
- g. Preliminary Numbers for next year- still waiting for several "...Returning Forms"
 - i. Numbers are strong at this point, but do fluctuate.
- h. Bayview Elementary will be hosted by QE in September 2019 for at least 2 years
 - i. Seismic upgrade is a government priority right now.
 - ii. QE is a designated swing site for this.
 - iii. There is no real overlap on playgrounds, etc Bayview will have their own bell schedule.
 - iv. There may be some overlap with PACs and PAC events
 - v. Traffic is a number one concern. Bayside will hopefully have drop off on 16th by the bus and not on Camosun.
 - vi. Meeting with their PAC in April to figure out some things like lunches, etc.
