- 6. Principal's Report (Mrs. Nancy Paget))
 - Great start to school year and appreciates the warm welcome and thank you to Robert for translation service
 - Organization/Staffing updates: 13 divisions, 2 new divisions due to influx of students in Vancouver so new staff needed
 - Ms Miller Gr4/5 teacher now and starts Monday; meet the teacher will be held following Wednesday
 - o Ms. Trifkovic, gr. 6
 - o Ms. Mar Grade 7
 - o Ms Steele: new PE teacher
 - Posting for a supervision aide and support worker not yet filled

- Terry Fox Run great event and thank you for donations that raised \$1, 035, which surpassed the target
- Emergency procedures
 - o will be outlined in school newsletter.
 - o Expect 6 fire drills, 2 lock drills, 2 earthquake + reunification drills.
 - Teachers will review with kids in advance and parents can help support by reviewing at home too;
 - Fire alarm planned for next week;
 - o lockdown drill at some point where all interior will be locked but exterior doors remain open and she will say 3x over the PA that this is a drill lock down;
 - hold and secure occurs when danger in the neighborhood and then exterior doors locked
 - These are district requirements; planned for later October and in January; teachers are given heads up and teachers can give heads up to parents too to help prepare
- School cash on line: please sign up for this as there is no ability to pay by cash; please call the office if you need help to set this up
- Assessment and surveys:
 - CSL reporting: 5 communications through the year; helps identify where the child is at; 2 formal reports (1 at the end of January and the other on the last day of school); also can have communication with and through parent/teacher meetings
 - Foundation skills assessment (FSA) occurs in Gr 4 and 7. This is a Ministry of education assessment to get information from across BC on numeracy and literacy. Teachers will administer this through October 3 and November 29; teachers will send an envelope home with information and for consideration about the tests which are written and some on line
 - Learning survey for parents and students in Gr 4 and 7: seeking information on student educational experiences; how they feel about the school; parents can provide information in the survey
- Safety
 - Visited all classes and talked to kids about being and feeling safe
 - Parking lot: reminder the lot is for VSB staff; parents need to leave time to park;
 cross at intersections; called city to come do random checks; no parking and
 leaving car for drop off for more than 5min
- Meet the staff event: great energy and thanks to PAC and everyone for coming
- Communications: Newsletter and posted on QE website; Twitter account and will message out
- Teacher/parent conferences coming up so remember there will be 2pm early dismissal on October 18 and 19; teachers working to firm up times for meetings
- Photo days: rescheduled with different company to Thursday October 20; will send everything electronically with retake on November 17.

 - Money raised through hot lunch (thank you to coordinators; 4 vendors with nominal mark-up) and some years through direct drive

- Expenses:
 - teacher allowances to spend on class items
- BC gaming (non-curricular):
 - ~5000K given the number of students enrolled; for this fund, only students can benefit (e.g. body awareness; parent information session had to be paid for by other account)
 - Running club; gardening, sports day; grad ceremony
- o expenses are over revenue as carry over of money from previous years
- Accepted budget (motion to accept: Domina; seconded: Julia)

- Monday and Wednesday; great fundraiser; while more days may be sought from some, it
 is a lot of work, more costly for parents now so not necessarily affordable for more days
 and already do not sell out on the 2 days offered, and vendors get frustrated if not big
 sales.
- Grade 7 volunteers now which is very helpful
- Calhouns has contract to be only vendor on Wednesday
- Pizza Hut is a challenge as not always getting the follow up; Panago is board approved could switch to this after this term
