- 1. PAC Meeting called to order. 5:34pm
- Welcome. With deep gratitude and respect, we are honoured to be learning and unlearning on the ancestral and unceded lands of the x<sup>w</sup>məθk<sup>w</sup>əyəm (Musqueam), Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw (Squamish Nation) & səlilwətał (Tsleil-Waututh Nation). Introductions. (staff)
- 3. Acceptance of Agenda and any amendments: A. Reynolds and H. Hadden
- Acceptance of the PAC Meeting minutes from December 6, 2023, as posted on the PAC website. Accepted: B. Hirsh, A. Reynolds
- 5. Budget Update (Harper Hadden)
  - a. General Update.
    - i. Money from holiday bazaar donated to kids and families in need
  - b. Direct Drive Raised \$6,870. This will be spent, per the fundraising appeal, on technology for the school. With a small additional amount these funds should purchase 10 ipads or 10 laptops. Teachers will vote on which are most needed at this time.
  - c. Further Spending Resolutions from the non-gaming account:
    - i. 10 more ipads / laptops (approx. \$7,250)
    - ii. New Cart to charge and secure items (approx. \$2,500)
    - iii. 20 more ipads / laptops (approx. \$14,500)

Note that, at this time, the main priority for the teachers in the school is updating the technology students have access to in order to teach the curriculum.

Proposal: Hot lunch funds will likely exceed expected amount and could use funds from these other efforts to support purchasing further equipment for school community now so that the benefits are experienced by those contributing towards the funds

- Proposed vote: spend more money than from direct drive to support purchase
  of full set of ipads/laptops for a class along with a cart to hold ~30 laptops:
  passed unanimously.
  - o School can place purchase immediately but will confirm exact costing
  - Software is under licence to the VSB

- Point raised to look into how to get better awareness for the direct drive given the low input so that we may better reach our goals going forward

### **Learning/Event Updates**

- February
  - Celebrated Lunar New Year: Thank you to PAC and parents Lunar New Year celebrations
  - Students enjoyed the Games Day, Red Envelope Treat, Special Hot Lunch big success, and the performance. Appreciate the work and leadership of Ms. Chung, VSB SWIS Worker and our parent volunteers
- Ms. Empey's Gr. 6/7 Class in Art applying colour wheel learning learning how to use water colours; learned about lunar new year - why the animals were selected, and students shared their experiences; now they are completing celebratory lunar new year images - painting with water colours
- Black History Month
  - Students are working on a variety of projects and assignments in their classrooms
  - Valerie Jerome, African-Canadian retired Track and Field sprinter, competed in Olympics speaking to Gr. 5/6 classes
  - Ms. Kim's class read "Tar Beach" by Faith Ringgold and created a story quilt that matches her style of art for Black History Month. She was inspired to share her creative works and shine light on the civil rights movement.
  - Ms. MacDonald's Class used Kayak magazine to look for facts about Black
    History of Canada, definition of terms eg: discrimination -eg: what does that
    mean. The Board is meant to have students think and reflect upon why people
    fought for equality, human rights, justice.
- Sports opportunities for students:
  - Australian Football Introduction Grades 5-7 students school-wide sessions after Spring Break. Thank you to PAC sponsoring.
  - Rookie Rugby Coaching in Schools Divisions 1-6 Grades 5-7 Vancouver 7s sent trained rugby coaches to our school to work with students
  - Students participated in fun, action packed non contact rugby programming
  - Students attend Rugby Festival BC Place tomorrow

#### **Extra Curricular Update**

- Many clubs are on their way with good student participation (intermediate gr. 4-7). Chess, Drama, Reading, Writer's, Eco Club.
- With many clubs started a bulletin board with a master calendar is being created outside the office and in B Bldg for students to check re: date, time, location of clubs.

- Basketball Season is coming to an end. Girls and Boys are playing well. Moving to Tournament play. Thank you to Ms. Empey, Ms. Steele and Mr. Chapman coaches.

## 7. Traffic and Safety (Claire McClean)

- a. Lord Byng PAC has created a dedicated traffic committee to work together with the VSB and the city to improve traffic on 16<sup>th</sup>.
  - i. Lord Byng, JQ and QE PAC Executives have been in contact to share ideas and best practices to improve safety.
  - ii. Vancouver has announced that they will put in a flashing light crosswalk at 16<sup>th</sup> and Wallace.
  - iii. Lord Byng has requested increased police presence to catch speeders, asking for LED speed signage to be put up on 16<sup>th</sup>.
  - iv. JQ applied last year for a grant to add more traffic calming measures to Crown Street. They did not get the funding partly because they need city approval to add crosswalks, 4 way stops instead of 2 way stops and LED speed signage. JQ also runs a run Bike/Walk/Roll to school weeks twotimes a year. JQ did try shutting down part of Crown in 2022 but found that it increased traffic in the alleys and caused additional issues.
- Communication Coordinator for the Schools Traffic Safety Committee sought (collaboration between the three schools)
  - How can we improve safety on Camosun?
  - Looking for volunteers to be part of this larger group and stay informed of the discussion; and what QE may do to support safer streets
  - have to apply to get the safety training
  - ICBC does outreach; could do classroom safety chat
